## **Honey Creek Rodeo Debuts in O'Brien County**



Honey Creek Rodeo officially formed in 2020. It is a not for profit organization with a Board of Directors. The organization is member owned. It's membership comes form all over Iowa and also enjoys members from Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin and Illinois. It's current base of operations is in Glidden, Iowa.

The mission of Honey Creek Rodeo is to teach rodeo. They start with children. Their method is to match livestock size to the size and skill of the rider. Bucking bulls and ponies of miniature size are used for children. The animals used grow as the kids grow. This gives the kids the opportunity to learn tricks and secrets of rodeoing more slowly and with more safety. Matching size and skill creates a more controlled environment.

A typical rodeo sea-

son runs form March through August with an effort to avoid conflicting with other programs. That can't always be done Rose Genter, manger, said of their effort, but they do watch schools and other organized events.

A clinic is held at the beginning of each season in Iowa. The clinics teach roping, bull riding, handling the animals and the basics to newcomers. The clinics provide very close learning opportunities. "It is an opportunity to shape (the kids), doing drills and exercises that they can do at home. They begin getting on a bull. They can practice at home and then come to a rodeo event for more learning and practice.

More importantly than knowing rodeo, Honey Creek Rodeo works to teach youth personal growth. "We are here to try to teach . More importantly being good human beings. We teach taking care of the animals, each other, the grounds were we rodeo, the camaraderie," said Rose. "There are more low points (in rodeo) than high points. There are more falls than covering a ride. We help with improvement and coping. How to grow up to be a productive, positive human," she went on to explain.


Honey Creek Rodeo can be found frequently at County Fairs around Iowa and sometimes in the neighboring states. They are sometimes hired by Saddle Clubs.

They do far more events that a traditional rodeo. They have a wider range of (age) divisions in each of the events from Tiny Tots (under 6 years old) to adult Open Class with 4 to 5 entrants in each division and event.

Before a main rodeo event they hold a slack event. Those are the participants that don't fit traditionally into a division or event, but they come to learn. And this is where and when they can.

Honey Creek Rodeo utilized skilled judges and staffing for their rodeos. It is an added expense. And an added advantage.

## A Lifetime of Learning and Service to Agriculture

Darwin Gaudian, Primghar, serves the greater O'Brien County Community in many ways. He is a successful farmer and leader in the ag industry. Primghar 4H was part of his youth until he was a high school senior. Near the time of his high school graduation from what was Primghar High School, the resignation of one 4H leader created an opportunity for Darwin to take a new role in Primghar 4H, as a club leader. He served in that capacity until about 2015.

Before the creation of South O'Brien Community School District, joining the districts of Paullina and Sutherland (which also included the former districts of Gaza and Calumet) there was no FFA (Future Farmers of America). That was an organization brought to the new district by Paullina. And what a success it has been.

While being a 4H leader, Gaudian also served as an O'Brien County Fair Board member for a bout a decade. His Fair Board tenure began in about 1985. He was then elected as the board President. He has served in that capacity for about 30 years.

In 2015 Gaudian was appointed to the Iowa State Fair, a premier event in the nation. He was elected to the presidency in 2023 for a two year term and was just reelected in December to another two year term.

Many changes are visible at the O'Brien County Fair grounds through that time. Back in 1985 there were just a five livestock barn, 2 Quonset buildings and the show ring. At the time Darwin stepped into the leadership role, it had been about 30 years since anything significant improvements had been made to the facilities.

The administration building was the first project. He approached the O'Brien County

Supervisors for some additional funding to pull of a building project. He was successful and over two years, the Administration building was constructed with the offices and restrooms added the second year of the project, 1988.

Following the farm crisis of the 80s livestock entries at the O'Brien County Fair began to grow measurably. In fact, the need to house hogs became greater that the space available. So the board set to work to get a new building constructed. What is today used as the Poultry Barn was born from a need to house swine. To some extent, that change was reflected in the change in agriculture practices. But raising and showing pigs was something for the kids to do. And it has been successful.

Today the buildings are always full. Although the livestock numbers change the buildings are constructed as multi-purpose and can be used to meet the current needs. Over the years smaller buildings have been constructed for a certain purpose and then repurposed to fit the need.

The shining star is the Open Class building. The large center piece building is the pride and joy of the Fairgrounds. It has bathrooms, air conditioning, a stage and bleachers. The Wayne Maas Memorial Stage and bleachers with accommodating sound system is the most recent improvement. It is used throughout the year to outside events. The Open Class building has become a true resource.

Camping spots in the most recent 20 years have been added. There are currently 20 spots with power and water plus the spots the City has on site. Campers are a big thing and the addition of the camping spots reflects the O'Brien County Fair Board's responsiveness to current needs

and its flexibility to meet those needs.

Something Darwin revealed about the Fairgrounds during his youth is an improvement we take for granted today. The grounds were mowed just one time, right before the Fair 40 or 50 years ago. The grounds were sand and stubble. Over time his family and the Wagner family began mowing. The space is now respectable looking, even inviting. Investing the time and hard work into the grounds has become a Fair board activity.

There are no planned projects in the near future for the Fairgrounds. But there are conversations as they look into the future of the ag industry in O'Brien County.

One tradition of the O'Brien Count Fair that seems untouchable is that the events are free to the public. A new feature this year is the Honey Creek Rodeo. This rodeo will take place at the Horse Arena at the north end of the Fairgrounds and is free to the public. The cost of the rodeo is offset by the sale of signs around the Fairgrounds. They are \$500 to include the making of the sign and \$500 each year after.

The two Figure 8 Races on Saturday and Wednesday is a private event sponsored by the Primghar Jaycees and does have an admission fee, but the Fair Board was so pleased with the response to the 100 anniversary fireworks following the Wednesday race, that they are doing it again. You do not have to go to the races to enjoy the fireworks Wednesday following the races.

"I've enjoyed it. It's a lot with State Fair Board," said Gaudian as he noted that younger people who grew up here and moved away are returning. He mentioned they are good candidates to become more involved with the O'Brien County Fair.

## O'Brien County Fair's Second Annual Cinnamon Roll Contest

# Cash prizes awarded for the top three bakers in two classes

The wait is over and sweet scents and flavors will once again grace the O'Brien County Fair. After the overwhelming success of the cinnamon roll contest to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the O'Brien County Fair, it is time for bakers to measure their ingredients and preheat their ovens. Sponsored by the

O'Brien County Farm Bureau, the traditional cinnamon roll contest will be held on Wednesday, July 23, 2025. Contestants of all ages will be able to register and submit their wares from 11:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. at the open class building. Commencing at 1:00 p.m., on-site judging will be conducted by two well qualified judges who will select first, second, and third place winners in two classes.

Class 1: Cinnamon Rolls: Sticky, caramel, with or without nuts.

Class 2: Cinnamon Rolls: Frosted on top only.

Monetary prizes and ribbons will be awarded to the top three entries in each class: first place and blue ribbon will be given \$100; second place and a red rib-



bon will receive \$50; and \$25 will go with a white ribbon for third place.

There is no fee for entering and a baker may compete in both classes. Contestants may be either residents or nonresidents of O'Brien County. Criteria for judging will be based fifty percent on flavor; twenty percent on texture; twenty percent on appearance; and ten percent on aroma. Professional bakers are prohibited from competing. The entry must be prepared by the person exhibiting. Copies of the rules may be picked up at the O'Brien County Farm Bureau office or Iowa State Extension office in Primghar. As they wait with anticipation, contestants and their supporters will be able to enjoy other scheduled events of the O'Brien County Fair, such as the Educational Presentations & Working Exhibits; the Brent Allan Entertainment, and the Livestock Judging Contest. Results of the cinnamon roll contest will be announced as soon as the judges complete their evaluations.




